Preparations are well underway for what is shaping up to be another outstanding two-day event at the Broadmeadow track. This will be the second Spring Carnival conducted on the StrathAyr surface, which has been a revelation since racing began on the new course proper in March 2017.

Friday September 14th is the main day of racing with four Group 3 races aimed at the racing purists. Welcome to the Sharp Electronics Group as the Newcastle Gold Cup sponsor on a long-term Ladies Day on Saturday September 15 is a more agreement which will also see prizemoney for the feature race over 2300m increase from \$175,000 to \$200,000. Last year the race was won by the Gai Waterhouse and Adrian Bott trained Broadside, ridden by Central Coast resident Tim Clark.

Not to be forgotten are the remaining seven races on the day. Hunter based syndicators Australian Bloodstock will again sponsor the Group 3 Cameron Handicap over 1500m. They are fantastic supporters of not only Newcastle, but racing in Australia. This edition of the Cameron Handicap will carry a total purse of \$160,000. Who could forget last year's Melbourne during peak carnival times. The three thrilling finish with local trainers Jay Hopkins and Kris Lees fighting it out with their respective horses Got Under and Sound Proposition. The margin in the end was a nose in favour of Got Unders which provided the Hopkins stable their first Group winner.

Yarraman Park continue a great association with the NJC which will see them again sponsor the Group 3 Tibbie Stakes over 1400m for Fillies and Mares run under set weights and penalties. Yarraman Park, owned and operated by Arthur and Harry Mitchell recently lost their up and coming stallion

sensation Hinchinbrook in a paddock accident, but have Champion sire I Am Invincible and first season freshman Hellbent still to carry the flag for the Scone based farm.

Hungerford Hill Wines are welcomed onboard in 2018 as sponsor of the 3YO Spring Stakes. Last year the Godolphin trained Astoria took the honours before placing in the Group 1 VRC Derby at Flemington.

relaxed day of racing with a party like feel. The two feature races that will be held on the day, both worth \$40,000 each, are the 900m Hurricane Handicap and the Newcastle Nobbys over 1400m. The two days of racing will see 16 individual races conducted for prizemoney over \$1.1 million.

Spring racing is an exciting time of year for trainers, jockeys, owners and all other industry personnel. Newcastle is fortunate to have some great trainers that use the outstanding training facilities daily which enable them to have runners in Sydney and trainers to watch out for over the coming months are Kris Lees, Ben Smith and Paul Perry.

It was a breakout season for Ben Smith who emerged from the Autumn Sydney Championships Carnival a dual Group 1 winning trainer. His star sprinter, In Her Time, finally claimed a long overdue Group 1 win taking out The Galaxy at Rosehill in March this year. The mare has won eight races from only 20 starts and has collected of total of \$2,135,725 in prizemoney. Racegoers at Newcastle on Gold Cup day will be treated to an exhibition gallop by In Her Time as she prepares for the \$13 million Everest at Royal Randwick in the past twelve months, he trained 191 1/2 winners on October 13. She is the only New South Wales nonnationwide, 30 more than the previous year. Another big Spring campaign looming for Australian Bloodstock

In just under a decade, Jamie Lovett and Luke Murrell ten years ago that the black and white check sleeves have seen their pet project turn from a mutual passion, that they hoped might go ok, into an international racing phenomenon. The thoroughbred syndication business the two horse-tragics set up in 2009 -Australian Bloodstock, has not only had a starter salute the judge on the first Tuesday in November, but now consistently peppers the semaphore board with winners and place-getters in big races around Australia, and indeed globally, throughout the year. Their first taste of things to come occurred in April 2012, when 'Master of Design', the Redoutes Choice stallion they raced as the 'Three Blondes' Syndicate (presumably back when Jamie boasted a fine head of hair) - saluted in the Group 1 TJ Smith Stakes at Randwick.

But the real life-changer for us was when we sold Salomina on to Katsumi Yoshida.

But just weeks later, they purchased a German filly, Salomina, who had just won her maiden – and on the 5th August that year, in dazzling style, she went on to win the Group 1 German Oaks by three and a half lengths. Jamie Lovett now jokes about how tough it was in those early days, "You could say I was eating SAO biscuits for dinner until those two wins in 2012" he confessed, "But the real life-changer for us was when, after that Oaks win, we sold Salomina on to Katsumi Yoshida." This would be their first, but certainly not last, taste of doing business with the Japanese.

Since that time the Australian Bloodstock colours have been first past the post in no less than 35 Black-type races (G1, 2, 3 & Listed) and nine individual Group 1's – including, as mentioned, the 2014 Melbourne International stature, "I'm not Cup taken out by Protectionist.

And on to those now all-familiar - there is nothing are for racing here in more complicated to that story than Jamie believing

and cap should be easy to follow in a race - and a few notepad doodles later and there they were.

So, with the exception of their dual Group 1 winning Japanese stallion Tosen Stardom, now standing at Woodside Park Stud in Victoria, the rest of their equine team from last Spring will be back in action in 2018. Brave Smash will have another tilt at The Everest – the multi-million-dollar race that he placed in last year, and Big Duke will be aimed for the top staying races and hopefully another tilt at the Melbourne Cup, after an eye-catching fourth in the 'nation-stopping' event last vear.

In the early days their eyes were fixed firmly on the racetracks of Europe, and in particular Germany, for potential champions to bring to Australia. Luke Murrell is the form and time analyst and consumes pages of stats, results and replays like the rest of us consume a coldy. And their strike rate has been phenomenal even though nowadays it is a much more competitive environment finding international options for big races down-under. More recently they have turned their attention to the Japanese industry - and that new focus paid dividends straight away with Tosen Stardom and Brave Smash immediately making their mark at elite level out here last season

Given their significant global network, the Australian Bloodstock team have gained a unique insight into what makes the racing game go-round. Jamie Lovett is adamant that the prizemoney increases that have

occurred over the last couple of years in NSW are the key to the local industry's success and burgeoning sure people realize just how important those increases Australia. Most simply





don't understand that the equivalent races in the UK, for example, would be running for a fraction of the amount – maybe the equivalent of A\$15,000 – and we are going to be running for \$125,000 in Sydney on Saturdays from September 1st this year. It's an amazing stimulus for our industry" Lovett enthuses.

So, then when asked about what challenges are Australian Bloodstock is a great local success story facing the local industry, the syndicator is again, - and it 'keeps on keeping on' - just like one of their typically, straight on to the front foot, "Now we have classy stayers! Let's hope Spring 2018 becomes the prizemoney sorted, the priority must be stabling another season of highlights for those familiar colours facilities. Horses spend the vast majority of their time - ROYAL BLUE, WHITE HORSESHOE, BLACK & being prepared, fed and housed. I'm certainly hopeful the NJC can make their exciting stable plans a reality – and imbed ourselves as the key racing centre North of Sydney." Notwithstanding the heady successes and international notoriety of these equine movers

and shakers – they are still knockabout Hunter-coast blokes who haven't forgotten how important it is to win a race for their owners, whether it be at Muswellbrook or Moonee Valley,

"I still get as much of a buzz seeing our owners win any race now as I did when we first set this up, and the magical reality of syndicating horses in this great industry of ours is that the battler can have a serious shot at the big time – Luke & I are living proof of that." Lovett concludes.

Get to know...

IRISH WONDER WOMAN AND WINNING JOCKEY Louise Day

Tell us how you started your career?

I've ridden horses all of my life. My mother used to take me to the local races when I was 11 or 12 and when I got home I would gallop my pony around the field and pretend I was a jockey. A couple of years later a training complex was built on the property beside my house and after another frustrating couple of years, my parents finally allowed me go and ride out there. When I turned 17 I left school and moved to England to a trainer there so I could start an apprenticeship. I was there for two years and held my licence for the last year but I only had 10 rides in that time. It was a mental and physical strain and I struggled to see a future there for myself as a jockey, so in March 2015 I decided to go home to Ireland and try and come up with another plan.

How long have you been riding in Australia?

When I returned to Ireland in 2015. I rode out for a trainer there called Shane Donohoe. He told me I should think about going to Australia and he put me in touch with his friend Hugh Bowman. A month later I landed in Melbourne and started working for Ciaron Maher. The rules in Victoria meant I couldn't take out a licence to race ride unless I was a resident, so I decided to enjoy myself for a while and forget about the dream to ride. I had a great time but after a year and a half it was starting to drive me insane not being able to race. Ciaron told me to ask Kris Lees for a job in NSW as the rules are different here. Kris has been a fantastic support and I was able to take out my licence in March last year. I have just ridden my 50th winner since | started!



Do you have a favourite racetrack?

I didn't know who he was before I moved to Australia, but having known him from the beginning, and watching his whole journey with Winx, I find his ability to handle high pressure situations remarkable. I watch him a lot in his races on TV and really admire his patience and timing.

I started my career in thoroughbred racing when I was 21 at the English Jockey Club, London. After two years, I began working for an Irish bloodstock and shipping agent in Dublin which was great fun. I returned to Australia in the early 2000's and progressed to marketing, PR, media and communications based roles at Moonee Valley Racing Club, Racing Victoria, Victoria Racing Club, Betfair and joined the on-air broadcast team when Racing.com first launched in 2014.

As a Sydney-based freelancer these days, my primary clients are Melbourne Racing Club, Snowden Racing Stable and Highclere Thoroughbreds Syndications, so I'm working with dream organisations and getting the best out of Sydney and Melbourne.

I was born to promote the **99** industry at large and its turf stars.

My connection to racing goes back to when I was five. I used to take down the scratchings on the radio for my father. I also had a burning passion for the ponies so negotiated with my parents at the age of six to take me to a riding school every fortnight, which thankfully they did. There were endless book, movie, TV, press, radio and event requests, everyone wanted a piece for obvious reasons. It was intense and one of my proudest moments to have played a tiny role in that incredible feat – and to do it with a friend was the cherry on top. Michelle is a champion in every sense of the word.

Women Rising Up

The current media industry is super competitive, so it's every man or woman for themselves.

That said, female representation in the industry today is very healthy. I think for a long time although women have been interested, passionate and capable, some lacked the confidence to really back themselves and put their opinions forward in what was traditionally deemed a male-dominated forum.

Featuring Yarraman Park Thoroughbred Horse Stud

Have you ever taken a moment to ponder where it all began for the immaculate thoroughbred thundering past the finishing post in front of thousands in a cheering crowd?

It all starts well away from the racetrack, in a majestically located horse stud like Yarraman Park. Nestled in the foothills only nine kilometres south-west of Scone, the horse capital of New South Wales, Yarraman Park is right in the heart of the Upper Hunter Valley's famous horse stud community. Founded on 1200 pristine hectares of mineral rich, gently undulating tree-studded country, the farm is perfectly equipped for breeding and nurturing future racing champions. Accompanied by expert equine and industry staff are two colonial stallions and hundreds of alluring broodmares that are fortunate enough to call Yarraman Park their home.



This series will follow the triumphs and tribulations of three Yarraman Park mares in 'a year in the life of a broodmare'.

Broodmares & Reproduction

Mares are adult female horses, defined as being more than four years of age and a broodmare is a mare used primarily for breeding purposes. Broodmares have many different paths that they take to reach the broodmare stage in life. Many started their career as a racehorse and some were successful champions, whilst others may have not achieved the ultimate trip to the winners' circle, however, their genetics or pedigree as it is called, led them to become a broodmare. Other mares may have been destined to become a broodmare right from the time they were born because of their family ties.

Mares go into 'season' or 'heat' roughly every 19-22 days and this occurs from early Spring to Autumn. Mares will only go into season during this time as their cycle for breeding relies on a long 'photoperiod' (the length of the day) to ensure that their foals are not born during the harshest part of the year to ensure they are give the best chance of thriving. You may have heard the term 'putting mares under lights'? This is literally that - putting mares in barns with lights on to mimic a lengthening day - so they come into season to be served as soon as possible.

Each year many foals are born in a controlled atmosphere under the watchful eye of specialist equine veterinarians after an 11-month gestation period for the broodmare. Studs will have their staff watching

pre-partum mares 24/7 to ensure everything's ok. The fragile newborn foals will emerge from their mothers between 320 days to 370 days from conception, to grow up and carry with them the hopes of many; from the breeders of the foal, the carers of the foal at its most vulnerable, the pre-trainer who educates and strengthens them, the owners who purchase them at the sales and those who buy shares, the trainer who spends hundreds of hours preparing them, right down to the many people who will avidly follow their racing career

For racing purposes, all horses born in the southern stallions 'I Am Invincible' and 'Hellbent' whose reputations are almost as sizeable as their tall and muscular stature. The stud owns a top class broodmare band which is being constantly upgraded, and these broodmares support the Yarraman Park stallions as well as visiting leading Australian stallions. Yarraman Park prides itself on raising strong sound racehorses and all care is taken to find the perfect match when it comes to breeding. Around half of the horses born in Australia are bred in the Hunter Valley so when it comes to breeding season, these stallions and many others around the region, carry a very important role of 'injecting' the best of their bloodlines into their progeny.

hemisphere are given the official 'birthday' of August 1; this is so that racehorses can compete in a standardized class age by comparison. Just so you know – that date in the Northern Hemisphere is January 1. It is rare that twins are born from broodmares and if it occurs it can be extremely dangerous for both the mare and foals as horses are only designed to bear one foal. Horses are sexually mature at two years of age and can be 'bred' or 'joined' at that point, however, most

breeders choose to wait until the horse has reached growing maturity between the ages of four to five. A healthy well-managed broodmare can breed each breeding season well into her twenties, but it is not unusual to see a mare miss a year occasionally due to increasingly 'late' joins leading to a season 'off'.

Black Type

You will often hear the term 'Black Type' used around horse breeding and sales. It simply refers to the foal coming from a family-line or pedigree that has produced Group (1,2 or 3) or Listed race winning horses. The broodmare or stallion may also be Group winner or has produced the same. Once the horse has won one of these races, their form will be printed in any sales catalogue or included in their pedigree page from the stud book in capitalised bold black lettering, hence the term 'Black Type'.

Yarraman Park Stallions & Service

Yarraman Park currently houses two highly credentialed

During the busiest time of the year, breeding season, stallions will 'cover' or 'serve' mares up to three times a day; usually at 6am, 11 am and finally at 4pm. Sires can attract a fee to serve mares, and this season, due to his success and popularity, I Am Invincible served mares at the price of \$175,000 per mare. A stallion can 'cover' up to 200 mares in a season, but it is more usual for that figure to be between 100 and 150.

The covering of mares at Yarraman Park takes place in an oval, white painted timber barn, where both the mare and stallion are fitted with protective equipment to ensure the safety of all involved. Mares are fitted with padded shoes which will go onto her 'hind' or back feet in case she kicks out. Following this fitting, the mare is prepared for the stallion by a 'teaser pony' which will allow the team to check if the mare is in the right stage of her reproductive cycle and also to put the mare 'in the mood'. The stallion is brought into the barn, will sniff, mount and then cover the mare. Stud workers are constantly on hand to ensure the covering is performed safely and without injury to the animals.

Fruits of Labour

ago, comes to fruition as mares start to give birth to their foals. Under the watchful eye of seasoned stud professionals, mares are monitored and moved just before it is time for them to deliver their foal in Follow the Series a 'maternity ward'. These specialised paddocks are floodlit from sunset so that they can be monitored throughout the night by the night watcher. An instinct well ingrained into their very nature is for mares to give birth during the night, which in the wild serves to protect their newborn foals from predators. The aim is to allow the birth to happen as naturally as possible, however, there is always someone on hand to step in if something goes wrong. Only 30 minutes after birth, the foal is able to stand and take their first steps, instinctively towards their mother's milk.

The Cycle Comes Full Circle

Following numerous health checks for both the nursing foal and the broodmare, the mare can be served again a month after giving birth. This seems harsh, but for horses, this is normal and mares successfully nurse Beginning early August, the hard work from 11 months a foal before it is weaned at 4-6 months (turning from foal to 'weanling') whilst carrying her next season's foal.
